Important Legislation Passes

Three important pieces of legislation that I authored passed the Legislature this session.

SB 1891 - gives the Department of Land and Natural Resources greater enforcement powers to protect our public lands and prevent ATVs and other vehicles from illegally driving on our beaches.

SB 2373 - requires retailers to maintain an electronic log of pseudoephedrine sales (a primary ingredient in making "ice") and submit a monthly report to the Department of Public Safety.

SCR 70 - directs the Legislative Reference Bureau (LRB) to do a study on the feasibility of establishing a degree program for Sports and Entertainment Management at UH.

Both SB 1891 and SB 2373 would give law enforcement better tools to protect our community and environment. The bills are now on Governor Lingle's desk awaiting her signature. She has until July 8th to sign the bills into law, allow them to become law without her signature, or to veto them.

SCR 70 starts the conversation aimed at developing a program at UH to train future leaders in the sports and entertainment industries. SCR 70 doesn't need the Governor's approval, so the report is scheduled to be completed before the start of the 2009 Legislative Session next January.



Senate District 19 Benefits in a Big Way from State Construction Funding

Senate District 19 was fortunate to have received \$295,509,000 in construction funding in the 2007-2009 State Budget. Last year, the budget included funding for important projects, such as UH West Oahu, the North-South Road, East-West Road, and the Kapolei Court Complex. This year, we were able to secure an additional \$37,668,000. The projects include:



- \$20,000,000 Ft. Barrette Road Widening
- \$9,255,000 Kapolei Judiciary Complex
- \$6,600,000 Kalaeloa Barbers Point Harbor Improvements
- \$850,000 Kalaeloa Safety Improvements
- \$500,000 Malama Learning Center (at Kapolei High School)
- \$200,000 Makakilo Baptist Church Preschool
- \$163,000 Waiahole Water System Improvements
- \$100,000 Barbers Point Elementary Improvements



UH West Oahu Zone Change Almost a Reality

I submitted testimony in strong support of Bill 25, which is currently before the City Council. This bill would allow 500 acres of land to be rezoned so that the future campus of UH West Oahu can be built.

You may have heard that the first phase of the campus is scheduled to be completed by Fall 2010. Bill 25 passed the Zoning Committee on May 13th. The next vote will be on June 4th when the bill is considered by the full City Council. I encourage you to get involved and testify on this very important bill. My staff and I very much enjoyed coordinating the State Senate's efforts for the 2008 Hawaii Foodbank's 19th Annual Food Drive. We were able to hand over \$11,922 and 6,222 pounds of food to the Foodbank, which is the most the Senate has ever raised!

The Senate had a friendly competition among the different offices and various incentives along the way to earn points for helping in



this year's food drive. The Senate Minority Research office finished first with 15,175 points, Senator Ron Menor's office placed 2nd with 10,510 points and Senator David Ige's office came in 3rd with 9,260 points. As part of the incentive to motivate the other Senate offices, I offered prizes to the winners: 2 tickets on board the Star of Honolulu whale watching and luncheon cruise ship, a gift basket of assorted goodies from the Gabbard ohana, and a private gourmet lunch prepared by my wife Carol and me.

I presented Matt Westmoreland with an honorary certificate from the State Senate at Island Pacific Academy's (IPA) Spring Sports Award Banquet on May 16th. Matt was recognized for winning the Interscholastic League of Honolulu (ILH) Boys Singles Tennis Championship at Patsy T. Mink Central Oahu Regional Park on April 23rd. IPA Principal James Nelligan was on hand to watch Matt defeat Punahou's Doug Ho, 6-2 6-2, in the title match. This marked IPA's first ILH title in school history.

As a former professional tennis player and coach, I know what kind of dedication it takes to excel on the tennis court. Matt's parents and the IPA ohana are rightly proud of this outstanding accomplishment.

Matt is a 16-year old IPA sophomore who lives in Pearl City with his parents, Homer and Helen. He started playing tennis at age 11. When he was in the 8th grade, he traveled around the mainland and attended an on-line school so he could one-pointedly focus on improving his tennis game. He was ranked as high as 31st in the nation.

This year 185 videos were submitted by local students from public and private middle schools and high schools around the state. The HMSA video themes are fitness/nutrition, being drug and tobacco-free, and underage drinking prevention. Social health was a new category this year, created to cover issues such as teen pregnancy, internet safety, bullying, teen suicide, and date rape. In this category, Guanzon and the other Kapolei High School students submitted a 27-second commercial entitled *URSPACE.COM*. The piece was selected based on the original and compelling content, its excellent videography, as well as its effectiveness at getting the message across to viewers.
